Current PhD Research Project Ideas



The Institute for the Study of Welsh Estates (ISWE) is dedicated to promoting research into the history, impact and functioning of Welsh estates. ISWE works with a number of Academic Schools within the College of Arts and Humanities – including the School of History and Archaeology, the School of English Literature, the School of Music and the School of Welsh – and would welcome enquiries about developing/ potential doctoral projects focusing on estate archives and the history, culture and landscapes of Wales, including:

- The impacts and influence of the Penrhyn Estate
- *Plastai*: Exploring the links between bardic and building culture in Wales, c.1450-1650
- Coming of Age celebrations in Wales, c.1740-1930: community relations, dynastic continuity and contesting Welsh identity
- Fashioning the Penrhyn Estate: architecture, agriculture, industry and land agency – the Wyatt influence
- Patronage and performance: Music in Welsh households
- Country house libraries
- A multilingual domain? Landlords, tenants and the place of the Welsh language on estates
- Estate maps and dynastic landscapes (including GIS approaches)
- Death, commemoration and demographic crises
- Forestry and the Welsh estate (historical perspectives and heritage potential)
- Projects utilising the records held by *Bangor University Archives and Special Collections*

Enquiries are also encouraged from those seeking to develop a specific research topic of their own.

Nod Sefydliad Ymchwil Ystadau Cymru yw hyrwyddo ymchwil i hanes, dylanwad a threfniadaeth ystadau Cymru. Mae'r sefydliad yn gweithio gyda nifer o Ysgolion Academaidd o fewn Coleg y Celfyddydau a'r Dyniaethau - gan gynnwys yr Ysgol Hanes ac Archeoleg, yr Ysgol Llenyddiaeth Saesneg, yr Ysgol Cerddoriaeth ac Ysgol y Gymraeg - a byddem yn croesawu ymholiadau ynglŷn â datblygu projectau doethurol posibl sy'n canolbwyntio ar archifau ystadau ac ar hanes, diwylliant a thirwedd Cymru, gan gynnwys:

- Creu ystâd y Penrhyn: pensaernïaeth, amaethyddiaeth, diwydiant ac asiantaethau tir - dylanwad Wyatt
- Perfformio a Nawdd: Cerddoriaeth yng nghartrefi Cymru
- Llyfrgelloedd plastai gwledig
- Parth amlieithog? Landlordiaid, tenantiaid a safle'r Gymraeg mewn ystadau
- Mapiau ystadau a thirweddau llinachyddol (gan gynnwys dulliau GIS)
- Marwolaeth, coffau ac argyfyngau demograffig
- Coedwigaeth ac Ystadau Cymru (safbwyntiau hanesyddol a photensial treftadaeth)
- Projectau sy'n defnyddio'r cofnodion a gedwir yn Archifau a Chasgliadau Arbennig Prifysgol Bangor
